

To present exhibits from a remote location, parties may utilize the web-conference interface to share the screen of their respective computer. Parties must notify the Division of Water Rights if they will participate by web conferencing. Grand Canyon Trust and PVR are allocated one hour to present their argument, and Deseret Generation and Transmission Co-Operative is allocated one hour to present its argument.

The sole issue to be addressed at the hearing is whether Grand Canyon Trust and PVR have standing to challenge Deseret Generation and Transmission Co-Operative's Water Right No. 49-258 (a38730) pursuant to Utah Code §73-3-13.
